As Beth shares, "I am relieved that there is an organization like HFLSD that can help community members in need during difficult times. When I lost my job, I was extremely worried about what would happen. Working with HFLSD and being able to remove my credit card payments on a monthly basis, while receiving extra each month for living expenses allows me to focus on my job search and not feel strangled by my monthly expenses. I am always inspired by the strength and drive that our loan recipients display through every conversation I have with them, and the gratitude for the work we are doing.

It is remarkable to see how much we have grown, and to watch HFLSD establish a foothold in the community.

But really, what you want to know is how much did we help the community, and those numbers are impressive! In our first year:

- HFLSD received over 90 loan inquiries
- 80% of inquiries became loan applications
- 23% of applicants received loans

And with every inquiry, we learn. We learn how to move loan recipients through the process more efficiently. We learn how to identify those that are eligible for a hand up with a loan, versus those that need more of a handout. We learn where to refer those that we cannot help. And we learn how to ensure that every call we receive feels supported and heard – whether we can help them or not!

Danya has a unique tie to the world of Jewish free loans, and HFLSD was thrilled to complete 2021 by processing this loan. Serving as one of Danya's guarantors, her uncle David shared that he "was delighted when my niece asked me to serve as a guarantor on her loan application to Hebrew Free Loan of San Diego."

"Not only did I admire her drive to fund as much of her own graduate school education as possible," David explained, "but I loved letting her know that her turning to HFLSD for help completed a four-generation circle in the Schulman family, for sixty years ago my father's uncle helped endow a similar Jewish free loan fund in Long Beach, California."



Her goal is to focus entirely on her schoolwork and experience all the hands-on training they offer, finishing off her last year doing clinical trials and research in her field.

She feels that "this loan will give me peace of mind during the next two and a half years while studying. I won't have to worry about how I will be able to pay for tuition as I know that there is a dedicated team standing behind me that want to see me succeed."

"School is an investment, and I know that it will open more doors for me. With that said, I hope to one day be able to give back to this organization to help others who are trying to fulfil their dreams in life. Ultimately, tikkun olam (repairing the world) is what I hope to achieve and HFLSD supporting me now will only allow me to do more in the future."

 Determine eligibility for an HFLSD Loan and find the HFLSD loan program that best fits the borrowers need

 Request completed application forms including necessary guarantor forms





 Review application and request any supporting documentation necessary

 Conduct loan interview with Executive Director and 2 Board Members





 Loan Committee votes whether or not to approve the loan.

 If loan is approved, check is issued and automatic payments begin 30 days after
